Case Study:

Building a Safer Digital Environment: St. John the Apostle Primary School's Digital Journey.

This case study explores how St. John the Apostle Primary School addressed digital challenges, specifically issues stemming from students' online activities, and how they emerged stronger through proactive measures, highlighting a united front of staff and parents.

The problem and its context

St. John the Apostle Primary School grappled with a digital dilemma. The school had limited insight into their students' online activities, both at school and at home. The knowledge gap became evident as issues of and emotional struggles surfaced on the playground.

Conversations with concerned parents during cyber safety education sessions revealed that excessive late-night device usage led to fatigue and sleep deprivation among students. In some instances, offensive language and behaviour observed on the playground seemed to originate from the digital space. This behaviour might have been influenced by online games or interactions where students were exposed to or participated in offensive language.

Despite the school's commitment to nurturing social learning skills, new challenges emerged in guiding students to effectively navigate their emotions and resolve conflicts online. The school recognised the need to adapt and respond to the dynamics introduced by the digital world.

While such issues were not frequent, they underscored the necessity of a more comprehensive approach to understanding and managing students' online activities. The school sought to ensure their safety and promote positive behaviour, both in the offline and online realms.





The Linewize journey

The arrival of the COVID-19 pandemic posed a unique challenge. Melbourne faced extensive lockdowns, and rapid adaptation to remote learning was imperative. Every student was provided with a device, becoming an integral enabler of their learning and socialising.

In response, the school recognised the importance of a comprehensive digital online safety approach and implemented steps to better protect students online. This involved community education sessions, staff professional development sessions on student digital online safety, and educational efforts for parents regarding social media and online safety.



This collaborative approach fostered unity and a deeper understanding within the school community. As a result of uniting parents and school staff, St. John the Apostle Primary School has established more robust digital safeguarding solutions that enable them to confidently address any issues that may arise within the school. Previously, there might have been incidents that went unnoticed, but now they can respond promptly and take appropriate actions. This unity has provided them with greater peace of mind, knowing they have a stronger and more informed community dedicated to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of their students in the digital age.

Impact

The school's limited visibility of the digital space was a wake-up call, but it became a catalyst for change.
